Part I

1. The Principal's Report

Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Govt. College Begumganj Distt Raisen was established in 1983. The premises having area of about 10 Acres. Arts, Science & Commerce are the disciplines being taught in the college. The college is affiliated to Barkatullah University Bhopal. From 1988 the is getting UGC grant. About 1300 students are studying; Begumganj is a rural tehsil of Distt Raisen. The most of the students are from remote rural areas. Their lingual knowledge is normally very poor to overcome this problem the college organizes coaching to them. The government already decided various programmes for over all development of students like carrier guidance, Yuva Utsav, Sports, N.S.S. environmental awareness etc. and the college arranges them.

The college make every possible effort for the benefit of students. So that they can make pace to complete with students of urban colleges.

2. Overview

(i) Vision, Mission and Objectives of the college

To impart quality education to the students of the region at the same time want to make them employable so that they become important human resource for the nation.

(ii) Brief introduction of the college

Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Govt. College Begumganj, Distt. – Raisen, (M.P.) is a M.P. Govt. Institution, The college is affiliated to Barkatullah University Bhopal . U.G.C. recognition given in 1988. Begumganj is situated on NH No.86 A on Bhopal Sagar route, which is 125 Kms. From Bhopal. Since 2004 the college is shifted to new premises having area of about 10 Acres.

(iii)History of the college with significant milestones -

Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Govt. College Begumganj, Distt. – Raisen, (M.P.) was established in 1983 in a small private premises with only Arts Undergraduate level. The college is affiliated to Barkatullah University Bhopal was started with 79 students and 6 faculties and with 6 subjects in 18-08-1983. 1987 Science undergraduate, and in 1988 Commerce Undergraduate level courses also started. Two Post Graduate courses in Arts – Sociology and political Science were started in session 1990. The institution is having Co-Ed education, because it is the only Govt. college in that remote area (Begumganj Tahsil) . Begumganj is situated on NH No.86 A on Bhopal Sagar route , which is 125 Kms. From Bhopal. Since 2004 the college is shifted to new premises having area of about 10 Acres.

Now in present session 1352 students admitted for regular teaching and about 350 students are expected to appear on private basis for the various courses running in the college. Apart from regular courses in the college, this college also facilitates the students of other disciplines for appearing in examination conducted by the Barkatullah University Bhopal (e.g. Urdu, History, Hindi, Sanskrit, Economics, --etc.).
