Later on in July 1987 the college was taken over by the State Govt. of Madhya Pradesh.

The college campus is spread over 52600 square meters. It is situated on the main road to Gohad, only 900 meters away from N.H.92 and so enjoys easy access from every locality. Initially, it was started with Arts Stream (B.A.) only but with the steady progress, considering the demand of local society and changing social needs B.Com. (Commerce) and M.A. in Hindi, English, Sanskrit and Sociology were initiated as self-financed courses in the year 2003, M.Com. in 2013-14 and B.Sc. classes started from academic session 2014-15.

Today, "**Maharishi Arvind Govt. College**" is the only Govt. College situated in Gohad Tehsil. Since its inception, the college has been imparting education to the students from all sections of society. STRENGTH –

1. The institution is funded by the State Govt. The salaries of the teachers as well as administrative and clerical staff are granted by the State Govt. Hence, all the staff works without any monetary tension.
2. Highly Qualified Teachers: - The staffs engaged in teaching whether regular or contractual consists of highly qualified teachers.
Teachers with Ph.D. - 06
Teachers with P.G. - 08
3. Jan Bhagidari Samiti: The institution has the support of Jan Bhagidari Samiti which is statutorily constituted in compliance of the State Govt. norms.
4. No Interference of Politics: The College is not politically interfered. Hence all the academic activities go on smoothly.
5. Easy Access: The College is situated on the main road to Gohad 5 KM away from the main city and only 0.9 KM away from N.H.92. Easy conveyance to the college is available from every locality of the city.
6. The college has large premises where various centers/departments for academic excellence can be established.
7. The college premise is under C.C.T.V. Surveillance.

WEAKNESS –

1. **Lack of Regular Teachers and Office Staff** - The College has only 04 regular teachers and 01 clerk in its office. Hence, apart from teaching, these regular teachers have to do many administrative and office works. Therefore, sometimes they find it difficult to give their best to the institution.
2. **No Permanent Principal** - The post of Principal has been vacant since 2012. The senior most professor has to monitor all the administrative and other activities while performing his own academic activities.
3. **Inadequate Infrastructure** - The College is running short of adequate infrastructure. There is a lack of Smart Class Rooms, Laboratories, Auditorium, Seminar Hall, Girls Hostel and Boys Hostel etc.
4. **Administrative Bottlenecks**– Delay in processing of files and decision-making mainly due to acute shortage of office/supporting staff.

OPPORTUNITY –

1. **Employability** - With the progressive attitude of the teachers and support of Janbhagidari Samiti such professional courses can be introduced as are helpful in job-procurement, and with good intake of students ready for innovation even the existing UG and PG programs can be taught in more constructive and innovative way enhancing their employability.
2. **Co-Education** - As the college is a co-education institution, we have an opportunity to hike the number of girl students; foster in them courage and boldness to survive and succeed in adverse conditions and to go on shaping their life and careers contributing to the nation-building.
3. **Benefit of Govt. Schemes to Girls** - As the college has a considerable number of girl students (around 64%) all the benefits of govt. schemes for the upliftment of girl students from all sections of society.
4. The college has a good intake of the students coming from the weaker sections of society such as SC and OBC. Hence the college has the opportunity to work for their upliftment by providing them study material, job-oriented guidance and extra classes (remedial classes).

CHALLENGES –

1. **Adhocism/Contractualism** - Adhocism or contractualism in the Dept. of Higher Education is one of the biggest threats. Number of Guest Faculty is higher than the regular teaching staff. The sense of responsibility and commitment which is required for the development of any institution is somewhat missing in Guest Faculty Staff.
2. **Nodal Office of Scholarship** - The College is a Scholarship Nodal Office of 22 private colleges. The limited staffs has to check, verify and sanction around 4000 scholarship applications of these colleges every year, which causes great disturbance and puts obstacles in the way of academic activities.
3. **Mushrooming of Private Institutions** - Mushrooming of private institutions is also a threat to the college and the society as well. In Gohad Tehsil alone there are 05 private colleges running with few staff, be it teaching or office staff. They lure students by assuring them better examinations results and scholarships.
