- 1. The Principal's Report (2 pages)**- Highlights the key activities, events, and successes of the past year and briefly describes major new initiatives to be undertaken over the next year.

We are proud to say that during the last session we organised several campus and open placements, in which several companies selected 668 candidates, which included alumni and outside candidates as well. It is a matter of great pleasure that prestigious companies like ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Vardhman Industries, Dupont, IFBI, Reliance Insurance and Magnam group have started coming to our college in search of talented students. It is a matter of great pride for us that we are instrumental in providing initial employment to our students and neighbourhood.

We organised Tally, Mobile Repairing And Beking training workshop to students of the college in 2017-18, in which 218 students participated and got benefitted. It is our firm belief that IT and software training will enable our students to perform better in the field of career advancement.

Our NCC wings were effectively active during the year. One of our NCC Army wing (Boys) cadets went to RDC and 1 to TSC. Similarly, one of our NCC Army wing (Girls) cadets went to TSC. 4 of our NCC girls got selected in M.P. Police. One of our NCC naval wing cadets went to Nausainik Camp, while 12 got 'C' certificate ad 14 got 'B' certificate. NSS students

participated in record plantation of 2nd July and performed Nukkad Natak for spreading awareness.

Last year we have initiated cashless transaction in the college as per the guidelines of government.

We have started self-defence training for girls and female staff and imparted them Judo training and martial arts training.

We are conducting virtual classes in our college, where online experts teach and interact with the college students.

Yoga is being promoted in the college. On the occasion of National Yoga day, our students and staff performed Yoga.

IIT Mumbai has started 'Spoken Tutorials' for all the students of our college, in which about 1300 students learnt basics of computer. This is to assure that all the students of our college become computer-savvy and get hands-on experience with computer technology.

Under E-shakti programme, 1450 female students and teachers received computer training.

In the field of sports, our college has kept its prestigious record. College organised Divisional Football (Girls), Basketball (Girls), Basketball (Boys), and Divisional Badminton (girls) and tournaments in our college. College has organised State-level Softball (Boys & Girls) tournament in our college.

Our 06 students participated in All India University sports tournaments during the year and 12 students participated in State-level tournaments. One Students Participated In International tournament.

In the year we organised To national seminars in the college to promote research. We have to make our campus fully Wi-fi to provide internet access to students.

(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

Government Narmada P. G. College, Hoshangabad, Madhya Pradesh was established in 1954 and has been declared as an Institute for Excellence in 2002 by the state government.

- Since 2008-9 semester system has been introduced in all programmes of UG/PG by the MP State Government and Barkatullah University, with which the college has been affiliated.
- The lecture method of teaching is the general method of teaching. However, computer training, projects, internship and CCEs are compulsory. The teaching is supplemented with Power Point presentation, LCD slides, OHP, computer-assisted learning, seminars, projects, group task etc.
- The concerned departments use modern teaching aids through computer viz. PowerPoint Presentation, LCD presentation, ICT, audio-visuals multimedia etc. There is also a Network Resource Centre (NRC) in the college, where the students can use net facility.
- In semester system, there is a provision of CCE, project and Internship to make the education system more job-oriented and qualitative. In CCE, students are evaluated twice in each semester by various methods. 30% marks are assigned for internal examination and tests. Students are evaluated through tests, report writing, seminars, power point presentations etc.
- ICT is now being increasingly used for innovation in teaching.
- The college has 3 units of NSS, including one girl unit and two wings of NCC viz. Army wing and Navy wing. The college also has a Youth Red Cross Unit, which organizes blood donation and health checkup programmes in the college.
- All indoor and outdoor sports are fully available. A sports complex at the cost of Rs. 90 lakh is newly constructed.

- There is a Moot Court in law for the purpose of practical training.
- Narmada College is the only college of MP, where Short Firing Range and Obstacle Training Practice is available to NCC cadets.

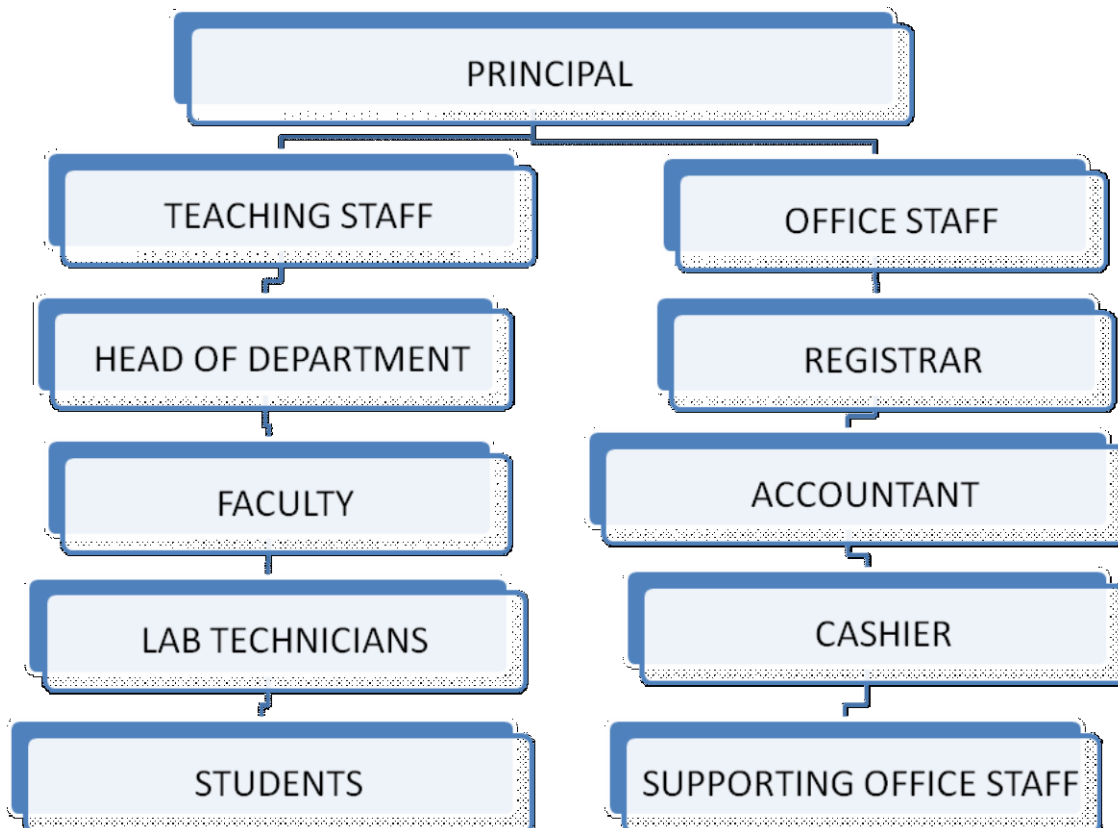

We are proud to say that during the last session we organised several campus and open placements, in which several companies selected 871 candidates. It is a matter of great pleasure that prestigious companies like ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Vardhman Industries, Dupont, IFBI, Reliance Insurance and Magnam group have started coming to our college in search of talented students. It is a matter of great pride for us that we are instrumental in providing initial employment to our students and neighbourhood.

We organised IT/Software training workshop to students of the college in 2017-18, in which 312 students participated and got benefitted. It is our firm belief that IT and software training will enable our students to perform better in the field of career advancement.

Our NCC wings were effectively active during the year. One of our NCC Army wing (Boys) cadets went to RDC and 1 to TSC. Similarly, one of our NCC Army wing (Girls) cadets went to TSC. 4 of our NCC girls got selected in M.P. Police. One of our NCC naval wing cadets went to Nausainik Camp, while 12 got 'C' certificate and 14 got 'B' certificate.
