- 1. The Principal's Report (2 pages)-** Highlights the key activities, events, and successes of the past year and briefly describes major new initiatives to be undertaken over the next year.

Govt. Degree College Dhamnod has a unique identity and attracts education aspiring poor students towards itself as it is the Tribal college of the Indore division. The college is a great ray for Girls (they are in majority 60-70%) as it is situated in Tribal belt. The socio-economic profile of these students of tribal area is very low. This college was established in 1989 since then it has been trying to develop itself as to fulfill requirements of the changing time. At the time of establishment it had only BA and B.Com courses. Now it is imparting higher education in Art and Commerce, with computer application. During the last few years there has been a lot of developmental activities, which include development of infrastructure, stage, ramp and department-wise development of resources, establishment of resources in library, full fledged laboratories computer education and carrier oriented syllabus.

Public Participation Committee had been constituted and has been performing various development works since then. Seminars, Conferences and various camps have been organized with the help of various development funds of Govt. UGC and PPC. Various committees (Vivekananda Career Counseling Cell, committee for prevention of sexual Harassment against women, Anti-Ragging, Disciplinary, Women Empowerment Cell..) have been working for the betterment of the students of this institution. The college always lays emphasis on nurturing cultural and moral values among students. The students of this institution have participated, performed and excelled at various competitions at various levels (Inter collegiate and Inter District). The college promotes such participation by constituting committees (Sports, Extracurricular and co-curricular, NSS and Red Ribbon, Women Empowerment Cell formed) especially for these activities N.S.S. and Red Ribbon of the college have been associated with organizing of various indoor and out-door camps on various community oriented works, which have helped in the all round development of the students. The goals and objectives of the college are crystal clear. It is devoted out and out to students of this tribal belt. Our goal is the empowerment of women consequently the encouragement of women particularly those belonging to the weaker section including Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes/Other Backward Classes and Minorities. To make them alert to education, health and productive resources is our object. We endeavor to provide quality education at all levels, health care, vocational guidance and safety of learners.

The Principal heads the institution and is solely responsible for all the decisions (in co-ordination with various committees) taken inside the college campus. The principal takes reports of all the departments and all the meetings as he is the sole representative of the state Govt. He takes decisions according to the orders of the state Govt. and gets them properly implemented.

This is a govt. college and is managed according the state Govt. policies and the best practices suggested by the State Govt. are implemented to create a conducive atmosphere for the poor students of the region to facilitate them to acquire, the education they require. In the management hierarchy the staff council and other members of the college come at the last and principal is above them. The decisions taken by the Principal reflect the state govt. Policies regarding the education and development of the students. The college is affiliated to Devi Ahilya University, Indore under section 2(f) and 12 (b) . It offers. B.A., B.A. Computer, B.Com Computer, at the under graduate level. And college preparing to get affiliation for MSW and Bhoj Open University from next session.

The college has students enrolled in the current session. The admission of the students in based purely on merit and it scrupulously implements the reservation rules of the State Government. The institution welcomes the entry of students from marginalized groups and many of them belong to rural or poor family background and are first graduates of the family.

The college has team of 09 well-qualified teaching and 07 Non-teaching staff members.

To enhance the teaching quality, the institution encourages the faculty members to attend orientation and Refresher course and supports the faculty in organizing and attending seminars, conferences, workshops, Training etc. The suggestions and recommendations put forward given by the faculty and students are taken into consideration. In integrating god's and objectives with the calendar is followed CCES are conducted well in time. Special classes, Zero classes and Bridge classes are organized for the benefit of students. Eminent subject experts and scholars are invited to the college to share their expertise with the faculty and students. Field trips are conducted for the exposure of the students in real life situation. The college provide Wi-Fi facility.

Students are encouraged to participate in all activities of the college viz. lectures, talks, workshops, cultural events, trips and surveys, camps, co-curricular activities, literary activities etc. The college also understands the need of communication skills of the students. Special classes under the 'English Language Improvement' Programme and Hindi Language Improvement programme are conducted. The environment consciousness of the staff and students has been expressed in an assortment 'Paryavarn Chetna. The college makes special efforts to preserve our folk culture and instill the culture values among students. College students have compiled folk songs under the title – "Tribal Folk Songs" (Janjatiya Lok Geet).

The department adopts the teaching, learning and evaluation strategies of the UG Programmes with the aim of equipping the students to successfully face competitive exams like UGC-NET, PSC, and UPSC, RAILWAY, BANKING, MPPEB (VYAPAM) etc.

The IQAC cell chalks out a programme at the beginning of session and pursues it in the matters of teaching, learning and evaluation through periodic meeting. The academic progress of the students is carefully and continuously monitored. Emphasis is laid on assignments and continuous internal evaluation. We keep our focus on students in teaching learning method. Free internal access is provided to students in some departments. The college has a rich library as well as some department libraries.

Students belonging to ST/SC get books, stationery and other facilities from library College.

The college provides welfare schemes and students support programmes for the advantage of the students. The institute provides financial assistance to under privileged students through various scholarship schemes. NSS, Red Ribbon club also try their best to inculcate social responsibility among students. The Career Guidance Cell organizes workshops and training programmes and guides the students regarding job opportunities available for them.

Unity is our strength. The responsibility given by the Principal and members of the college help in sustaining and reflecting the vision and mission of the college through all the activities of the institution. Guidance and co-operation of the Principal to the IQAC coordinator, superintendent of Examination cell, Head of the departments play a vital role in offering a collective leadership in all dimensions of organizational management. The financial support comes from funds granted by UGC, Public Participation Committee and state Government. The college possesses a campus of 18 acres. There are 08 rooms, a library, and 02 laboratories in the college in the departments of Geography, Computer. The college also provides facilities to practice of table tennis, Judo, Karate Chess etc.

The college has been adhering to best practices such as excellence in teaching and research, discipline, professional ethics, honesty etc.

To make the campus eco-friendly, emphasis is laid on green initiatives and energy conservation. The college always endeavors to sustain a green environment in the campus.

- Regular faculty refers to faculty employed on open-ended, full-time contracts as per UGC norms.
- Contract faculty refers to faculty employed on fixed term, full-time contracts as per UGC norms.
- Guest Lecturers refers to faculty employed on a per lecture or per day basis as per UGC norms.
- Data on scholarships is to be reported on all scholarships awarded between 1st October of the previous year and 30th September of the current year.
- A hostel seat is considered occupied if a student has been allotted a seat in the hostel and the student, to whom the seat was allotted, has paid the hostel fee for the current academic year.
- Examination results refers to the average score obtained by a student, in the respective academic year, across all exams that are used to assess whether the student has met the requirement of the degree program in which he/she is enrolled.

- An international journal is one that has an International Standard Serial Number (ISSN) issued by the ISSN International Centre.
- A paper is said to be published through cross-institute research collaboration if the primary affiliation of at least two authors is to different colleges/institutions.
- The institutional performance indicators common across all institutions can be found in the PIP. Institution-specific performance indicators can be found in the MOU signed between the Institution and the Department of Higher Education.
- The standard Chart of Accounts refers to the standard format for audit reports as notified by the Department of Higher Education through its orders.
