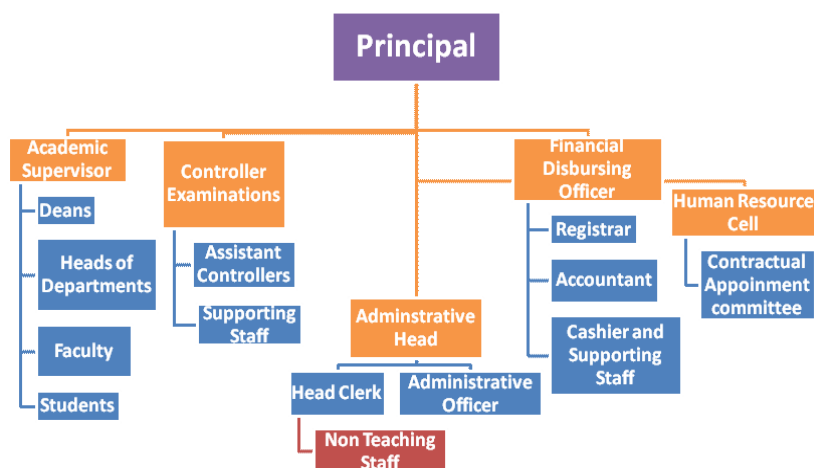
- The college came into existence in 1965 and was then having arts faculty only.
