- (i) Vision, Mission and Objectives of the college

The college always keeps its vision before it and works towards nurturing competencies in the students to equip themselves to serve the society and nation. Through the prescribed curriculum and through the co-curricular activities, it aims to impart communicative, computer and different professional skills among its students to make them able to contribute to the development of the country. To achieve this objective traditional class room teaching has been supported with modern electronic facilities like computers, LCD projectors, computers and internet connectivity etc. Through NSS activities students come in contact with the society, become aware of their status, problems and understand their own responsibilities to serve them.

(ii) Brief introduction of the college

Govt. P.G. College Rampura was established in a temporary building. It shifted to its present building in 1972. The college has a vast campus spread over 72.3 acre. The present building was constructed on old pattern which overlooked the future demand of space hence a few rooms are very small without proper natural light facility. There are 12 classrooms 4 labs and a library in the building. With the aid of Govt. and UGC recently 05 new classrooms and a computer lab and a staff room has been constructed. We make optimum use of existing building & run the college in two shifts with BA & B.com, MA & M.Com in morning & B.Sc & M.Sc in noon. A virtual class room is high-tech video classroom that facilitates education teaching, learning through distance mode.

We have closed accessed library with 25828 Books & a small reading room. Daily Newspaper are also displayed. We have set up e-library with Govt. aid. However vacancy of permanent librarian since 1998 poses constraints in its running and the automation of the library.

The college is a multi-faculty college which runs courses in the facilities of Arts, Commerce and science with 6PG departments.

(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

Government P.G. College Rampura was established in 1958 has been an old and prestigious seat of learning in Madhya Pradesh and quenched the thirst of knowledge of students of vast area belonging to manasa, garoth, Neemuch, Mandasaur, Bhanpura, Gandhi sagar, kukreshwar and other neighbouring area .with passing of time opening of colleges as per requirement in increase in number of students has had its reflection in declining students strength with merger of land under back water of Gandhi sagar dam. Economy of this area was hard affected. Which saw movement of people from this area.

At present the college caters to the local residents and students from nearby villages. in admission there is no restriction of high percentage there by providing education to all contributing to increase GER which is the main National agenda. The college is maintaining amicable academic environment to achieve its vision and mission. our qualified and dedicated faculties, office staff although few in number work efficiently and try hard for the development of the college and timely execution of policy matters in spite of several hurdles.

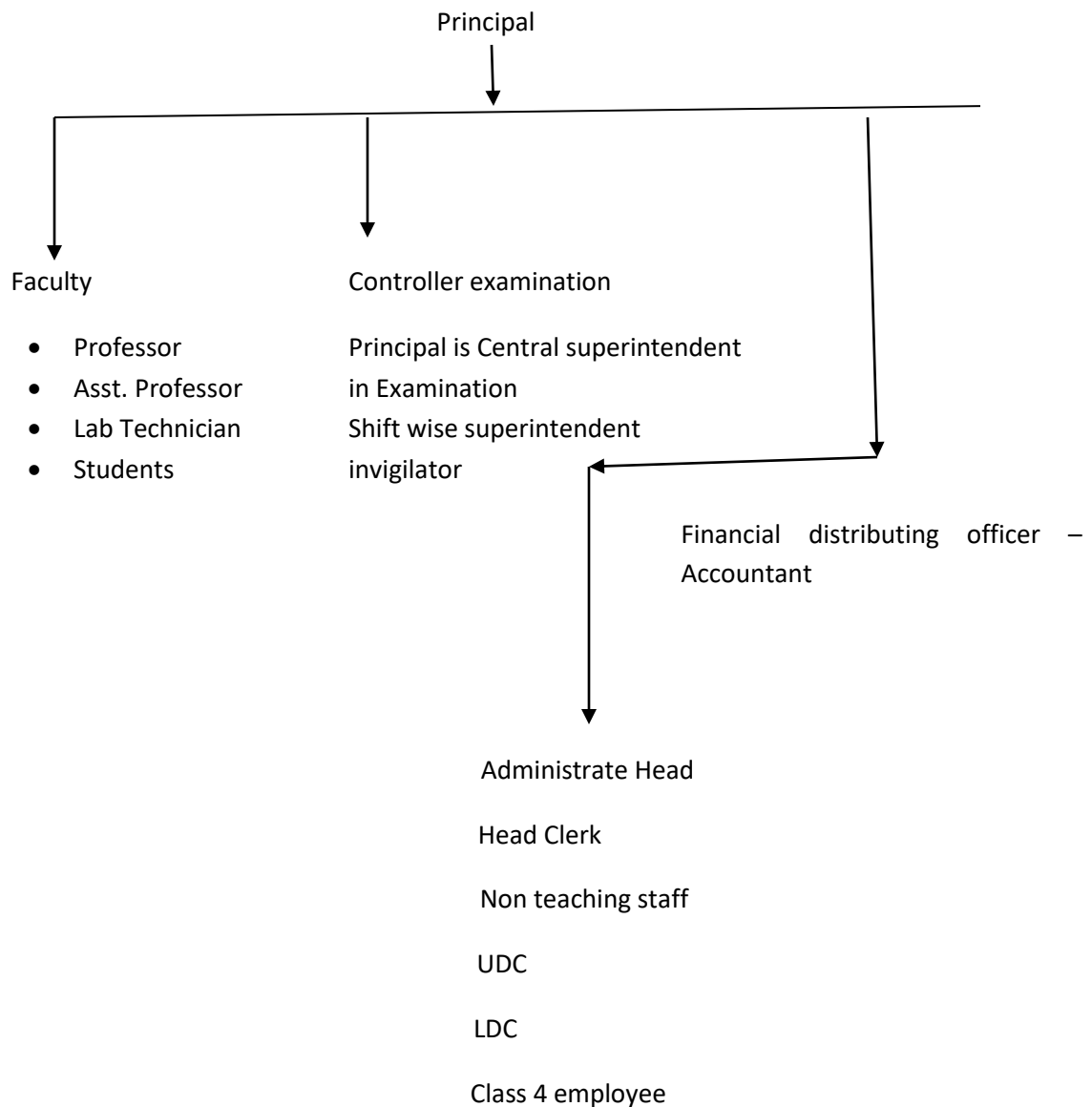

- ✓ **Gaon Ki Beti:** This is a scheme of the Government of Madhya Pradesh. According to this scheme a scholarship of Rs 500/- per month is given to a girl student who pass her 10+2 exam in first division from a school of a rural region in M.P. overall 178 Girls have been benefitted by this scheme.
- ✓ **Scholarships to SC/ST/OBC students:** According to this scheme a scholarship is given to SC/ST/OBC students. It is given by Adim Jati Kalyan vibhag.

✓ **Students with physical disabilities: the number of differently abled students is very low in our college.** Ramps are provided for smooth movement.

Students to Participate in various competitions/National and International:The College endeavours for the overall development of the students. Apart from academic excellence, it encourages students to participate in sports competitions, Youth festival competitions held at the national level. The Sports Officer, N.S.S. Officer and the In charge professor of the Youth Festival cultural activities select the college teams picking the best students after a rigorous process of selection. These students are provided special training and coaching and sent for participation in the district, division, state and national level competitions. In sports students are provided T.A. and D.A. for their visits to participate in tournaments. National level/state level players are also provided weightage of marks in admission. These students are honored with certificate and medals.

Medical assistance to students: health centre, health insurance etc.: The College takes care of the health and hygiene of its students and staff. The entire campus is lush green and pollution free. Water purifiers are installed in all the buildings. First aid kit is available in sports as well as NSS departments of the college.

A Group Insurance scheme covers all the students .

Extension Activities

The college establishes link with the society through the extension services rendered through NSS, etc. These extension activities are meant to make the students sensitive towards the community. Every year a one day plantation camp and a seven days Annual Camp is organized in a village adopted by the NSS unit of the college. Planting saplings, health check up of the villagers,

blood donation by the volunteers, cleaning the village and spreading awareness about hygiene and literacy etc. activities and works are done in the camp to encourage students to take up community services and to fulfill their duties towards the society and the humanity. The NSS wing of the college organized Voter's Awareness Campaign and performed street plays to motivate the people to cast their votes in the elections.
