(iv) Faculties and major disciplines

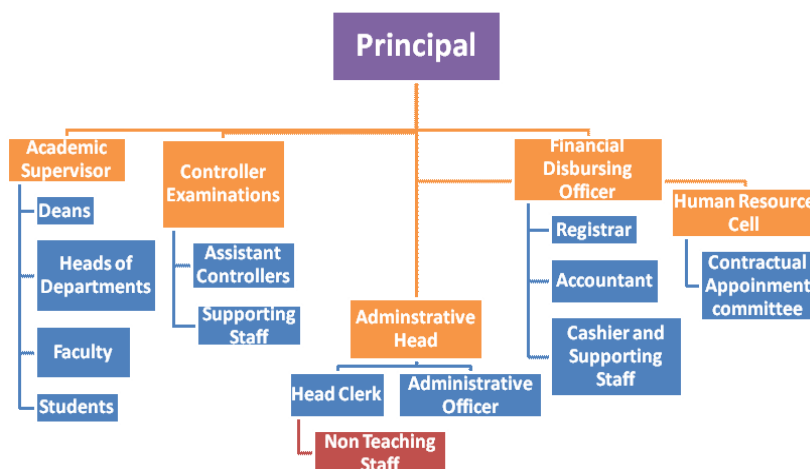
