Part I

1. The Principal's Report - Highlights the key activities, events, and successes of the past year and briefly describes major new initiatives to be undertaken over the next year.

This college newly established on 5th November 2016 surrounded by rural areas. The college provides BA and B.sc course 14posts are sanctioned, but not filled. Here are admitted world levelled backward tribe Baiga by cast, SC/ST and other backward students in all three classes.At present there are 126students enrolled in the college. Department of higher education has launched an online admission process which is absolutely transparent and in accordance with the reservation cum merit norms of the state government.

At present the College has 1 permanent principal in charge, and 13 Guest faculty in staff. They provide there well teaching and other cultural activities to the students. Till now there have passed students with good marks and also participated in sports and cultural activities in various level.

The Teacher-Guardian Scheme of the college helps in building cordiality between the teacher and the taught and this scheme proves to be an apt platform to resolve their grievances. The college has also adopted the feedback form the students to solve their psychological problems.

The college has no yet infrastructure for the conduct but is to be constructed early by PIU. It is conducted in a part of school presently. Proposal for science and commerce faculty is sent to DHE viewing the performance of students.

Financial support is available to the students in the form of State Government scholarships and various schemes for ST, SC and OBC students. State government of Madhya Pradesh has launched “Gaon Ki Beti” for the students of all categories. Books and stationary are provided to students freely every year.

The other student support services like Personality development, Career guidance, Youth festivals are conducted as per rule.

The institution also fosters the students to prepare them for social, cultural and ethical trends. Cultural and sports programs are also being organized according to the academic calendar of the university. The students also participate in various types of sport activities at local, district level, and have provided recognition and glory to the college.

The assessment of the performance of the teaching staff is mainly ensured by the Additional Director of the affiliated university and the Principal on the annual basis. The college has a number of welfare programs for students and staff, which include scholarships, group insurance, and medical reimbursement. Examination and result process is done under the direction of Rani Durgavati Vishwavidyalaya Jabalpur.

Thus the Govt. New College Mehandwani, Dist. Dindori is dedicated to turn its vision and mission into reality by putting in sincere efforts in all the sphere of academic, co-curricular and administrative activities.

- (III) The college runs the course of the Madhya Pradesh State Higher Education which is integrated by all applicable state or autonomous university colleges affiliated to these adjustment stake part Rani Durgawati University, Jabalpur the College is affiliated to the course according to the studies conducted here.
- (IV) The college is affiliated to Rani Durgawati University and does not have freedom of formulating its own curriculum; still the course run at UG has their relevance to the institution goals and objectives. The college determines to impart such knowledge as may be necessary for the all round development of character of the students. To reach out to the goals and objectives, the institution has evolved additional inputs in the syllabus to face the current trends in the competitive areas.

(VI) History of the college

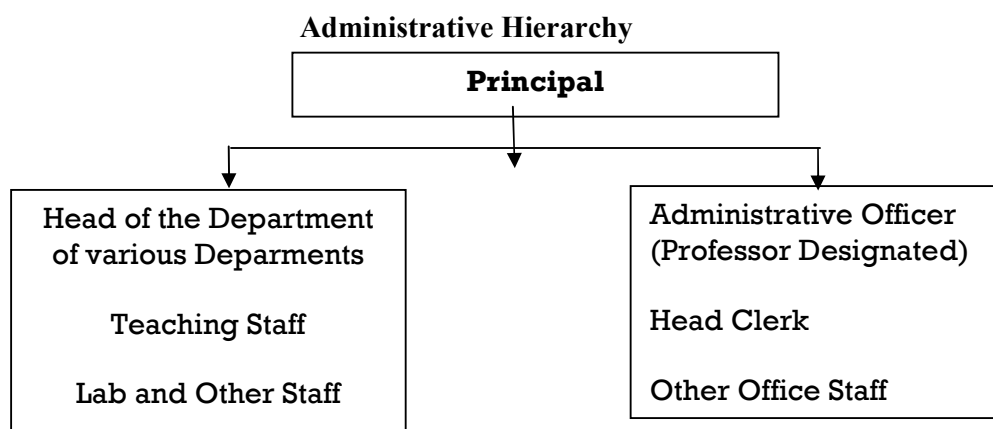
