9. Parents meeting is organized by the Principal in which they can personally discuss with him on any of the problem regarding to their ward's educations.
10. Vivekanand Career guidance cell provides opportunities to students for different jobs.
11. There are many welfare schemes for the students of the college started by Govt. of MP – Pratibha kiran, Goan Ki Beti, Transportation Allowances etc. Stationary/Books are given to SC/ST Students and SC/ST/OBC Scholarship are also given. Scholarship is also given to Minority students.
12. There is an anti-ragging committee in the college. No incident has been reported during last four Years.
13. The Sports game are regularly organized in the college as per the sports calendar framed by Department of Higher Education, Govt. of M.P. 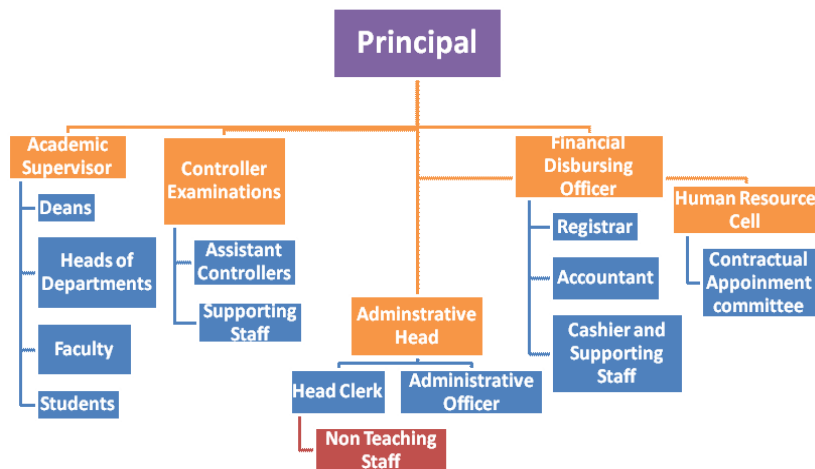

Library automation is under process. The library does not have a formal mechanism for getting feedback from its users. However suggestions by students and faculty members are given due consideration by the library staff.

✓ IT enabled services

The computer and internet facility is made available to the faculty and students on the campus. The institution plans and strategies for deploying and upgrading the IT infrastructure and associated facilities in the form of sending proposals to the Higher Education Department for procuring licensed software and purchasing computers to improve the student – computer ratio.

The institution facilitates extensive use of computer-aided teaching/learning materials in the form of power point presentations by the faculty and the students for their project work Virtual classes are also held as per plan of Higher Education Department. There is a drastic change from traditional teaching to innovative methods of teaching where teacher becomes informer and facilitator. The students are at the center of teaching learning process through PPT, smart class, internet and e-mail. The institution does not avail of the National Knowledge Network connectivity.

- ✓ Financial assistance (scholarships/ schemes for SC/ST/OBC/ minority, Group & Health Insurance Schemes)

- Students coming from the scheduled caste and scheduled tribe sections of the society are provided, other than scholarships, a study kit containing books, stationary, pen, pencil, dictionary etc. worth 2000/- per head.
- Students from very poor families are enrolled in the institution for **Rs. 100/-** as initial admission fee. This scheme has been launched from the current session.
- Physically disabled students are provided ramps for easy mobility.
- The college has a Janbhagidari Fund in terms of specific schemes available for students who participate in various national and international competitions.
- A group insurance scheme is available for students. In case of an unfortunate accident and death of a student, the family is paid Rs. 50000/ by the insurance company.

- ✓ Personal enhancement & development schemes- NCC, NSS, Facilities for physically challenged & slow learners; Tutor-Guardian Scheme, Grievance Redressal Cell, Entrepreneurship Cell, Remedial classes, Career Guidance Cell

- To support the slow learners, professors of the institution engage extra classes and guide them.
- Remedial classes funded by UGC are held in the institution for students to prepare them for various competitive examinations.
- Remedial classes are held for computer literacy and spoken English. Classes for spoken English and computer literacy have been started in the institution from the current session.
- The institution has a structured mechanism for career guidance and placement of its students. The Vivekanand Career Counseling Cell formed by the department of Higher Education M.P. held the student to identify job opportunities and prepare themselves for interview. The various job opportunities are in the area of banking, police, computer, aviation, administrative services etc.
- The institution have a student grievance redressal cell. The newly established CM helpline solves the grievances of the student on various issues.

- ✓ Extracurricular activities: Calendar of activities (Sports, Youth Festival, cultural and literary events), Achievements, Awards

Students participate in various activities as per the as per the calendar of the University and state government.
