Govt. Maharani Laxmibai, P.G. Girls College is a Govt. funded college affiliated to D.A.V.V. Indore. It is a multi faculty college and offers a wide range of under graduate & post graduate programme. 06 programmes (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com, B.B.A., Library Science and B.Sc. Home Science) are offered at under-graduate level. 15 programmes M.A. (Hindi, English, Political Science, History, Sociology, Economics, Psychology, Instrumental Music, Drawing & Painting and Dance), M.Sc. (Chemistry and Bio-chemistry), M.Sc. Home Science (Food & Nutrition, Textiles & Clothing) and M.Com are offered at post-graduate level.

Being a Govt. institution, it has a limited flexibility to frame the syllabi. For under-graduate classes' unified syllabus, designed by the Department of Higher Education, Bhopal is followed. For Post-graduate programmes, syllabus is prescribed by the university.

The institution takes all necessary measures for the effective implementation of the curriculum. The academic calendar, issued by the Department of Higher Education, is followed by the teaching staff. At the beginning of the session, Principal holds the staff council meeting, in which the entire chalked out plan is discussed and conveyed to the staff. For translating the curriculum effectively, the teachers strictly follow the time-table prepared by the committee. The institute extends its full support by providing all the facilities like separate departments, computers, internet, departmental library etc., to improve teaching practices.

Many professors of institution being chairpersons and members on Board of studies of affiliating university, play a vital role in the development of curricula for the programmes of Post graduation, M.Phil and Ph.D. entrance exams. The institute offers academic flexibility to the students by providing a variety of subject combinations at U.G. level.

Govt. Maharani Laxmibai P.G. Girls College, earlier known as Govt. New Girls College was established in 1965 (shifted from a school where it was founded in 1963) within a fort which was constructed by the Holkar State in 1860. It is situated in urban location.

The campus of college spreads over 13 acres with a built-up area of 7568.23 sq. meters. The institution is affiliated to Devi AhilyaVishwavidyalaya, Indore and is recognized by UGC under section 2(f) and 12(b).

(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

Govt. Maharani Laxmibai P.G. Girls College, earlier known as Govt. New Girls College was established in 1965 (shifted from a school where it was founded in 1963) within a fort which was constructed by the Holkar State in 1860. It is situated in urban location.

There has been a constant increase in the admission graph of students. The college began with a modest number of 28 students and by 2004, at the time of accreditation by NAAC, it had reached up to 1750. At present the strength of college is 2716. The college has been imparting education to the girls in six streams viz Arts, Science, Commerce, Home Science, Business Administration and Library Science. The Departments of Commerce, Bio-chemistry, Bio-technology, Library Science, Computer Science and Business Administration are running under self-financing scheme. The college has 26 Departments with a total strength of 78 faculty members, out of which 48 are regular and 30 are temporary teachers. The non-teaching staff comprises of 47 employees.

In under graduate there are 05 disciplines comprising of – B.A., B.Sc., B.HSc., B.Com., B.B.A. and in post graduate we have M.A., M.Sc., M.HSc., M.Com., and B.Lib.

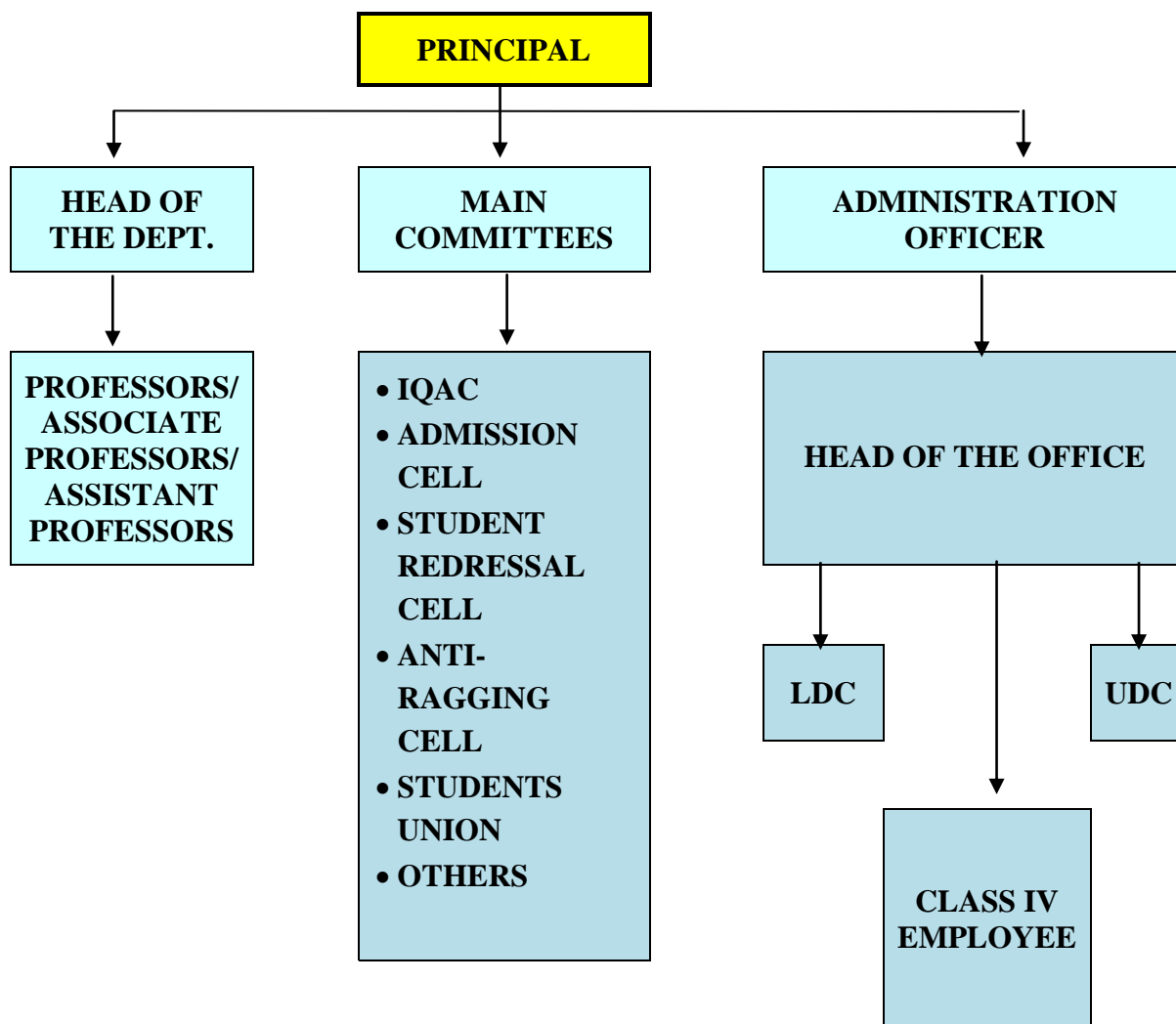

5. The Student Experience (4 pages)

Briefly describes student life in the college:

- Infrastructural facilities available to students - Classrooms, Smart classrooms, laboratories and equipment, Common Research Lab, Hostel; Canteen; Garden; Students common room, Auditorium, Sports Complex & other facilities

Facilities like, construction of ramps, railings and toilets are made available by the institution to meet the requirements of students with physical disabilities. For the physically disabled classes are held on the ground floor.

The residential facility and various provisions available within the institute are as follows:

- **Hostel Facility** – The institute has two wings of the hostel. At present one wing is functional and has 27 residential rooms for the accommodation of 65 students along with beds, tables, chairs, fans, coolers and wardrobes. Mess facility is available to the students. Telephone facility is provided to the students.
- **Recreational facilities** – Gym is available in the college premises for the students of hostel along with carom-board and Chess. An LCD is also installed for their recreation and education.
- **Computer facilities** – Computer facility is also accessible to the residents of hostel.
- **Library** - To upgrade their knowledge, students can make use of the books available in the hostel library.
- **Medical Emergency** –The institute has a chamber to provide medical services to students and staff. A part-time doctor and a nurse volunteer their services to meet medical emergencies and routine health check-ups.
- There is no Internet and Wi-Fi facility in the hostel.
- A indoor hall which serves as a make shift auditorium and an open stage are available in the college premises for educational and recreational purpose. Sports room also has the facility of providing games like carom-board and chess for recreation.
- A common staff room and a girls' common room are also available for the facility of students.
- Only one staff quarter is there in the college which is lying vacant at present.
- The college has constant supply of safe drinking water with the advanced facility of R.O. and aquaguard.
- **Security** – Three security guards have been appointed by the institute. One security-guard is for the day shift, one for the night shift, and one security-guard, for the hostel.

- Library, which is an integral part of the institute has a separate building.
- Total area of the library is, 2000 Sq. Ft.
- It has a seating capacity of, 25 students.
- The library remains open from, 10.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.
- There are no individual carrels and lounge area for browsing and relaxed reading.

- Library has an Advisory Committee comprising of four professors from different Departments.
- The Committee proposed to have computers, printer, xerox machine, internet and INFLIBNET facility in the library, which have been implemented. Besides these automation of the library has taken place to facilitate the students and teachers.
- The library staff extends its full support to the students and teachers by making books, journals and magazine available for reading and reference, from 10.30 am to 5.00 pm.
- Magazines and journals for competitive exams like P.S.C./NET/ SLET/Banking exams are made available to the students.
- Stationery & Books are provided to the students of reserved categories.
- Catalogues for new arrivals are also made available to the teachers.
- Students also have the facility to obtain unsolved papers of previous years.

- Units like N.S.S. and N.C.C. play a major role in providing a platform to the students to unfurl their potential through participation in various cultural, social and patriotic activities at state and national level.
- Occasional health checkup camps like- hemoglobin test, bone density test, eye test, blood group test were organized by the institution. Besides, hepatitis-B vaccination and preventive dose for swine flu was also administered to the students and college staff.
- Departments like Economics, Commerce and Career Guidance Cell provide extra guidance to students for competitive exams occasionally.
- Departments of English and Career Guidance cell organize lectures and workshops on spoken English and communication skills. Computer education is a compulsory subject at degree level which ensures computer literacy. There is a well established computer lab in the institution which provides theoretical and practical knowledge to the students. Each Department organizes lectures individually for, skill and personality development of students.
- Extra coaching and guidance is provided to the students who are ‘_Slow learners’.
- Internship, Project works and educational tours of the students provide them exposure and opportunity to come in contact with other institutions of high learning/corporate/business house etc.

The college organized various extracurricular activities throughout the session.

3. Annual improvement in academic, research & administrative Initiatives

- **Academic Initiatives**

The institution makes its utmost efforts to cater to the educational needs of students, belonging to different categories. To achieve academic excellence, the institution adopts pragmatic approaches. A complete transparency is maintained in the admission process, as admissions are made strictly according to the norms of university. The institution adheres to the reservation policy for ST/ST/OBC and differently abled students. Publicity for admissions is done through the prospectus and the college website www.vlbcindore.org. The success of institution is evident from the constant increase in the strength of students.

For making teaching-learning process effective, the teachers use various teaching methods to suit students of diverse learning abilities. Weak students are provided extra-coaching through notes and lectures. For better comprehension and practical knowledge, students undertake projects, internship and field visits, which give them an opportunity to have a deeper insight into the subject. The institution has highly qualified and competent teachers who constantly strive for individual excellence and keep themselves abreast of latest developments by attending national and international seminars, workshops and training courses.

To make learning more student-centric, a good infrastructure has been provided to all the departments which include well-established libraries and laboratories, projectors, computers with internet facility, which widen the horizon of knowledge. To nurture critical thinking, creativity and scientific temper amongst students, the institution ceaselessly organizes various curricular and co-curricular activities. Many eminent scholars are invited to deliver lectures on various topics to share their knowledge and experience with the students and teachers.

Activity and literary clubs, exhibition, cultural programmes and sports events give students a platform to express their hidden talents. Students' capabilities are assessed through CCEs, group discussions, assignments, surprise tests and their performance in university exams. The institute also receives feed-back from the students regarding the performance of the faculty.

- **Research Initiatives**

The institute promotes research culture along with teaching. To enhance research work, the college has set up a research development committee with the objective facilitating and monitoring research activities. The institute is a recognized research centre in Psychology, English, D/P, Chemistry and Home Science. 17 Professors are registered guides under whose guidance 61 research scholars are pursuing their research work for the degree of Ph.D. 08 Candidates have been awarded the doctoral degree and 05 have submitted their theses in past year. The

institute provides all possible facilities like library, computers, internet etc. to research scholars for pursuing their work. Teachers of the institute are also encouraged to undertake their research work. 42 are Ph.D. holders and four have the degree of M.Phil as highest qualification. Two professors are pursuing their research work for Ph.D.

International seminars were organized by the Dept. of Hindi and 2 seven day workshops were conducted by the Dept. of Home Science & the Dept. of Drawing & Painting.

In these international seminars 136 and 105 research papers were presented respectively. All research papers of this institute (Govt. Maharani Laxmibai, P.G. Girls College, Kila Bhavan, Indore) were published in the form of book with ISSN No. containing 38 research papers of this institute. Teachers of various departments have attended 08 national, 58 international and 03 regional seminars, 72 research papers have been published in various national & international journals.

- **Administrative Initiatives**

Principal is the head of the institution who appoints an administrative officer. An IQAC is constituted at the beginning of the session to chalk-out its plan for the quality enhancement and progress of the institution. Under the guidance of Principal various committees are formed to execute the plan. Members of the committee, under the supervision of their respective conveners, implement the various tasks allotted to them.

The principal holds meetings with alumni, stake-holders and students to invite suggestions for the progress of the institution. Staff council meetings are also conducted, at least thrice a year, to discuss major issues like admissions, student union election, examinations etc. Heads of the departments are given freedom and flexibility to take their own decisions in the interest of the students and institution. Various welfare schemes are available for teaching and non-teaching staff such as GIS, GPF, Medical leave, maternity leave. The institution ensures that grievances/complaints are promptly attended to and resolved effectively by respective committees.

Class III and class IV employers' recruitment and grievances, decisions regarding official matters and financial matters are made through meetings with the office staff under the supervision of Principal. By the end of the session all the proposed and implemented plans are evaluated and reviewed by the head of the institution and members of IQAC.

The institute receives additional fund through self-financing courses, which are used for the development of institution and the disbursement of salary to the teachers working under self-financing scheme. The accounts of the college are audited by internal and external auditors.

- **Student Support**

The record of progression of students is quite remarkable. Detailed information regarding criteria for admission, rules and regulations, courses offered, eligibility, fee structure etc. are made available on college website. The syllabi for Under-Graduate classes is accessible on M.P. Higher Education website, whereas Post-Graduate programmes are available on the website of Devi AhilyaVishwavidyalaya, Indore. As most of the students come from economically weaker section of the society (SC, ST, OBC, Physically challenged), they get financial assistance in the form of various scholarships. Meritorious students also get financial help under ‘PratibhaKiranYojna’. Students of N.S.S., N.C.C. and Sports are given extra facility of appearing in practical and internal exams other than scheduled time-table. Sports students are provided with incentives in the form of kits, certificates, cash and other articles.

To make the students aware about job prospects in various fields, the Career Guidance / Placement Cell works ceaselessly throughout the session by organizing, workshops, seminars and career fair. Renowned scholars and experts are invited to deliver lectures and enlighten students, especially about communication skills, personality development and spoken English. Despite coming from conservative families, many girls avail job opportunities, like - running their boutiques, coaching classes, serving in schools as, teachers and working as dietitians in well-known hospitals. Various departments like Commerce, Computer Science, Psychology, English, Home Science, Mathematics, Drawing & Painting and Dance motivate the students to become self-reliant and develop entrepreneurial skills. Activity clubs’ for students too, help in grooming their personality.

- **Events & Initiatives**

The institute took all necessary measures for the effective implementation of the curricular and co-curricular activities.

Academic calendar issued by the Dept. of Higher Education was followed by the teaching staff. The C.C.E. of Internal assessment marks were conveyed to the students and the assignments submitted by them was discussed.

Every department formed an activity club in which various activities like group discussion, paper presentation, on the spot story writing competition, quiz and talent

such programmes were organized. Throughout the session to departments & career guidance cell organized lectures of renowned scholars from various fields on behavioral aspects, independent learning, communication skill etc. for the overall development of the students. The student displayed their creativity and imagination through power point presentation. More than 200 students joined NSS participated and volunteered their services in various camps organized at different places. Camp for cleanliness was held, articles made by visually impaired and mentally retarded children was sold by NSS students to give them financial support. Guest lectures was organized to make the students aware about Parliamentary procedure. Besides these various other activities were also carried out through out the session. Two international seminars and Two seven days' workshop were organized by different departments during the session. Under sports activities students participated in various University & State level competitions and won prizes. In Youth festival also students participated and Dance, Music & Drawing & Painting competitions. Two students brought laurels to the institution.

NCC cadets of the institution gave remarkable performance throughout the session. One of the cadets was selected for International Youth Exchange Programme. Four cadets were selected S.S.B. Agra camp. Cadet Himani Ahirshinge was selected OTA Gwalior camp.
