(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

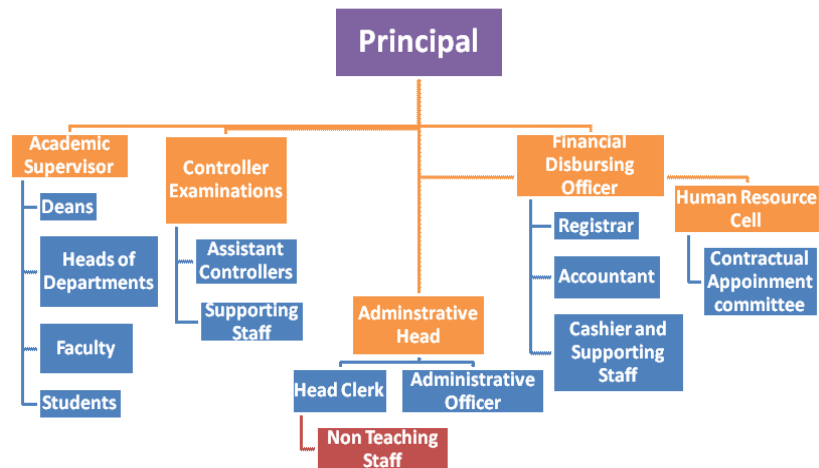
