

Annual Report 2016-17

This format outlines the annual reports to be published by all colleges participating in the Madhya Pradesh Higher Education Quality Improvement Project on their websites, by October 31st of each year. Part I is intended as a guide and colleges are free to alter the contents and format as they see fit. Part II, the Appendix (Institutional Performance Data and Financial Reports), is mandatory and colleges are required to report all data as per the attached format and instructions.

Part I

1. The Principal's Report

This is the oldest institute of higher education and the only post graduate college in the district and has been designated as lead college of Balaghat district. This lead college has to control all the eleven government colleges and fourteen private colleges including 10 B.Ed. colleges of the district. Formerly the college was affiliated to Dr. Harisingh Gour University (Formerly University of Saugar), Sagar, However, since 1996 Government of Madhya Pradesh, Department of Higher Education made changes by reshuffling the jurisdiction of universities of the state and affiliated this college to Rani Durgawati Vishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur (M.P.) in 1996.

A unit of senior division of N.C.C. and two units of N.S.S. (Girls and Boys) are also available in the college. The Staff members of the college have taken over the additional charge as N.C.C. officer and programme officer of N.S.S. girls and boys units.

This college offers 13 undergraduate courses including B.Sc. (Biology), B.Sc. (Mathematics), B.Sc. (Geology), B.Sc. (Computer Science), B.Sc. (Bio-technology), B.Sc. (Bio-chemistry), B.Sc.(Industrial Micro Biology), B.B.A., B.C.A. and B.A., B.Com.(Accounting), B.Com.(Marketing), B.Com. (Computer Application). There are in all thirteen postgraduate courses in the college, which includes the subjects of Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Physics, Geology, Mathematics, Geography, Sociology, Economics, Political Science, Hindi literature, English literature and Master of Commerce.

In the current academic session (2016-2017), two thousand Nine hundred Fifty eight students have been admitted in various programmes of the studies. Out of which 3351 students (1595 male and 1756 female) are undergoing various undergraduate degree & Post Graduate degree programmes in arts, science and commerce.

Under the student support services the college has a central library, a reading room, a computer system with internet facility, different sport facilities, a girls common room, an indoor badminton court, table tennis, grievance redresser committee, and a women cell etc.

The college encourages teachers to uptake research work as teacher fellows and whenever some teacher is selected for teacher fellowship to carry out work for the Ph.D. thesis, he/she is always granted study leave as per the directives of the department of higher education. The college is publishing a research journal every four months named "Jata Shankar Research Journal" for the last two years. The teachers of the colleges and the district contribute their research papers in it. ISBN number has been applied for.

The department of Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geology, Geography, English, Economics and Commerce are much optimistic to initiate active research work. In the department of botany already much of the research work has been done by Dr. S.M. Singh.

There are twenty Ph.D.'s in the college some of the teachers have been awarded the degree in the last four years. Thus with the release of financial support from University Grants Commission these departments undoubtedly shall start active researches.

Also some of the teachers of this college have an honor to be the unpaid advisory members or

the resource persons in the various programs/workshops/training programs conducted by the government departments like police, forest, industry, electricity board and Akashvani etc. and some semi-government and private sectors.

There is formed a student guidance bureau & counseling center (Personality development cell) in the college which includes a convener Professor Dr. Yogesh Vijaywar & three other professor member's including a lady professor. This center guides students about their career. A new Training and placement cell has been formed and Dr. Arvind Tiwari is the T.P.O. (Training Placement Officer). The same Professor sees into the complaints of the students against the university regarding their mark sheets and enrollment number etc.

There is also a first aid committee in the college including an incharge professor for boys & an incharge lady professor for girls. This committee provides first aid to the students in incase of any accident.

There is a common room for girls in the college with all the necessary facilities. A big hall for boys is also available which can be used as common room as well as for the extracurricular activities like cultural and literary programs and also a reading room as and when needed. A permanent stage has also been constructed last year in the rear part of the college. This stage is ideally designed for the stage programs. This is the place where the annual function of the college is celebrated.

The college has very amicable atmosphere of teacher taught relationships. The students pay great regards to the teachers and as such there is no discipline problem in the college campus. Parents/guardians of some of the students regularly keep in touch with the college for the progress of their wards. President and members of the Janbhagidari Committee are also always in constant contact to the principal and administrative officer of the college and take cares of the well fare of the college.

2. Overview

This institution is named as 'Government Jatashankar Trivedi Post Graduate College, BALAGHAT, Madhya Pradesh, PIN 481001'. In the building of the institution was previously started a private institution 'Jatashankar Trivedi High school, Balaghat'. The beautiful building was later on donated by Shri. Amritlal Trivedi, The younger brother of Late Jatashankar Trivedi to the Government for starting a college. In the year 1958, Government of Madhya Pradesh, Department of Higher Education, undertook the building and started a degree college with Arts and Science faculties. In the honor of Late Shri Trivedi, the college is named as '**Government Jatashankar Trivedi Post Graduate College**'. This college was upgraded as Post Graduate College in the year **1971**.

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This college has been recognized under 2(f) 1975 and 12(b) 1980 by University Grants commission and has been receiving financial assistance from the commission since 1976.

The college is located in the urban area of the district head quarter in the heart of the city of Balaghat, almost 700 meters southwards from Collector Office. Bus stand of Balaghat is hardly 500 meters and the Railway station is nearly one and half K.M. away from the college. Location of

Government district hospital, many private hospitals and the market of the city is also close by almost in the periphery of one kilometer to the college.

The college campus is extended in 2.56 acre of government land which was originally donated by Trivedi family. The college campus includes two main buildings. In old building, Principal's room, office, few departments (Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Hindi, N.S.S. room) and staff room etc. are located. In new building are located rooms for theory classes, four departments (Mathematics, Physics, Geology, and Geography), N.C.C. room and girls common room etc. Between two buildings a transverse wing of four rooms is also available in the campus. Besides this a big multipurpose hall is situated in the main building, which has been set up as non-residential students' common room cum reading hall. The routine extracurricular activities are also held in the hall. A new addition of nine departments (17 rooms) has been made three years back. Now every arts faculty has separate department with internet facility. A new computerized library has also been built and made use of by the students.

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The merit list of the University is represented by the good numbers of the students from this college. Every year both undergraduate and postgraduate students have held meritorious positions and some of them have been awarded gold medals by the University in the convocation ceremony. Meritorious students who have secured distinguishable position and toppers of different classes are also encouraged by the award of medals in the annual function of the college. Citizens of Blight are generous enough to have made the provision of various medals for the merit students. (List is enclosed as an annexure)

In all the post graduate department there is an association of the postgraduate students. A professor in charge and office bearers of the association takes up different activities under its auspices. Activities like organization of seminars, tutorials, quiz contest, I Q tests, and manage excursions for the field study etc. For the undergraduate faculties activity societies of the students association hold different activities. Society for social sciences and humanities conducts activity for students of arts faculty. In the same way society of science and technology and society of Economics and Commerce organize various activities to ensure participation of the undergraduate students of science and commerce faculties respectively.

In addition, in sports activity students of this college have shown their excellent performance. In the last four sessions in hockey 22, Volley ball 12, Basket Ball 09, Chess 04, Athletics 05, wrestling 02, Badminton 03, Cricket 08, Cha-Cha 06 students have represented state and inter University levels. The students who represent in state or university level tournaments are honored with the prize of a tracksuit by the college in the annual function. Captains of different teams of the college are also distinguished by the award of a chest crest to all of them.

In youth festival also, this college has earned a good reputation. Students of this college have secured position in the University in various activities of cultural programme such as folk dance, drama, clay modeling and also in quiz contest.
