Govt. College Devtalab Distt. - Rewa (M.P.) has been established in the year 2012. The newly established college has only Arts discipline at present. The faculty members consist of 01 regular Assistant Professor, and 1 assistant grade-3. The present IDP might be possible only if the vacant posts are filled by the government/higher education department. We have 02 computer systems for office use. Shri Surendra Mishra is the newly appointed Chairman of Janbhagidari Samiti. The College is going to be built near Govt. Higher Secondary School, Devtalab, District Rewa (M.P.). Its building is expected to be completed in Dec. 2018. It will be constructed in an area of approximately 04 acre. At present, the college is running in a Govt. Boys Higher Secondary School, Devtalab in 4 rooms.

The College is still not got accreditation by NAAC and not under recognised with UGC 2F and 12b Affiliation. It is affiliated to APS University Rewa .The college provide higher education in the disciplines of Arts at UG level. The college has the strength of 348 in the session 2017-18 with a majority of girl's student. This College is going to have a building of 6.5 Crore in near future.

- (iv) Faculties and major disciplines

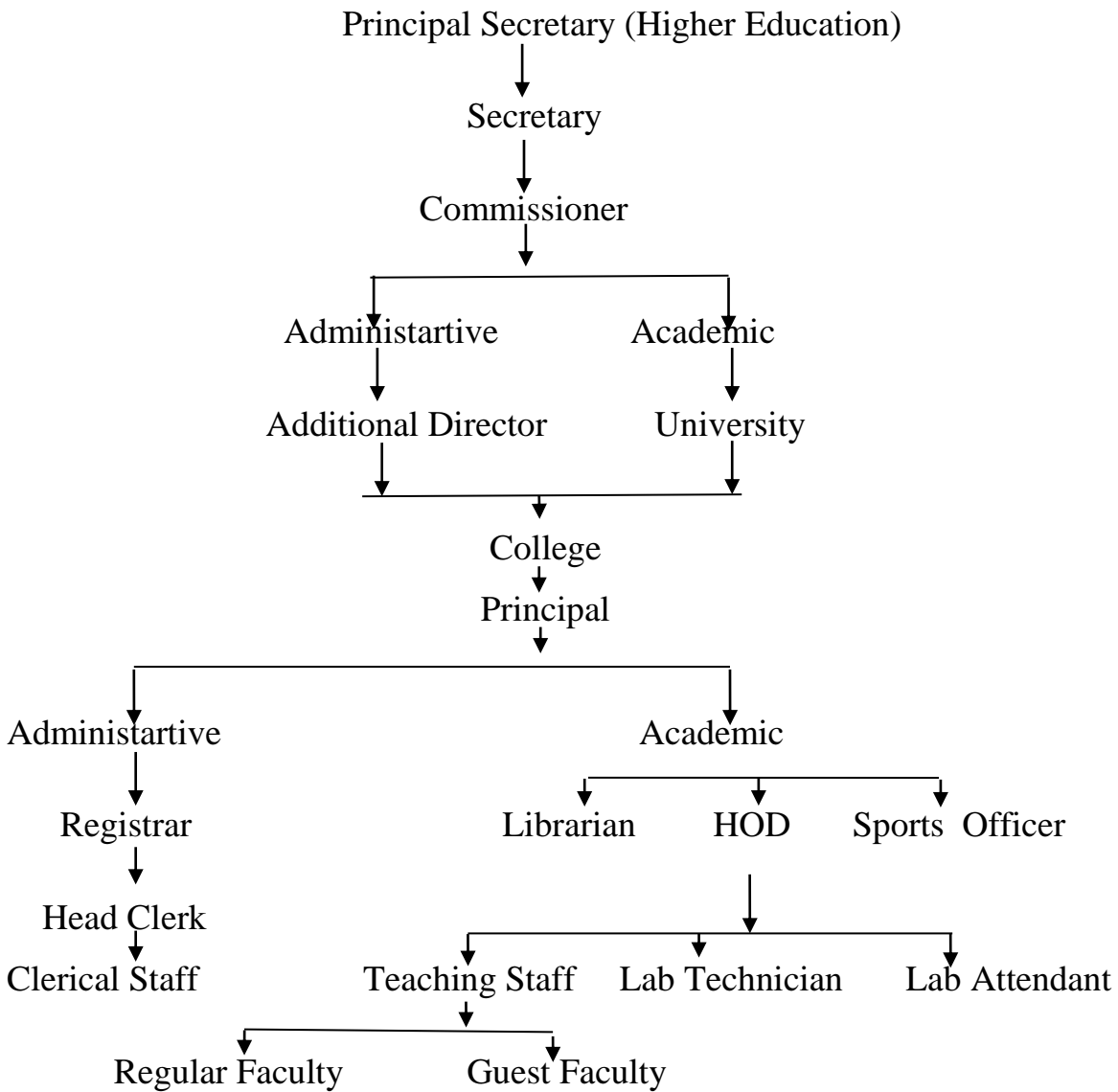
