Part I

1. The Principal's Report :-

Govt. College Nagod , established in 1984, having a long and event full journey has come a long way during the last 34 years . This journey has been a successful one and a heartening one too. Fulfilling the principal aim of teaching and learning this Institution has something to feel proud and for self-appraisal.

This college has registered an increase in the number of students in considerable number in the past year witnessing the number of students in B.A. I Year from 253 to 354 and from 126 to 178 in B.Sc. I Year .

Apart from classroom teaching , Practicals , Continuous comprehensive evaluation, examination and other curricular activities many other activities were carried out in this college during the last year .

In-order to achieve the aim of an all around development of the students many programs were organized by the Vivekanand Career Guidance cell and Personality development cell throughout the academic session .

Literary and culture activities were organized during the youth festival to provide opportunities to the students to chistle their Literary and cultural talent . Teams of the students participated at the district level . The students participating in the event secured first place at the district level and again they won first prize at the University level to represent the University at the State level youth festival to be organized by the Vikram University , Ujjain .

Taking the baton of success to the sports field three wrestlers of this college represented the University at the National level Inter-University wrestling competition at Calcutta and at the State level wrestling competition held at Indore.

we feel committed to carry forward our efforts to motivate the youth power of the college to play vital role in nation building. For this we must focus on the Personality development of the students . We also look forward to provide a healthy atmosphere in the college for the skill development of the students . For this we aim at organizing some skill development programs like - Mobile repairing , Hardware Networking and flower farming for the boys of this college and Beauty-parlour training course with Sewing training course for the girls in the forthcoming session. For this a broad roadmap is to be prepared which is underway . Good library facility , Inter class seminars , Literary and cultural activities and comprehensive sports activities are to be organized during the coming session . As the principal aim of higher education still remains to earn the livelihood with the students so we plan to organize skill development programs for boys and girls through out the session. We had been organizing sewing training , cooking training and beauty parlor course training for girls and computer hardware-Networking course for the boys in this college in the past years too.

2. Overview :-

Starting in a very modest way in 1984, with the sole purpose of imparting education to the rural, semi-urban or urbanizing areas, the college has come a long way and continues to strive to fulfil its mission in a qualitative manner. Govt J. T. College is located at a tehsil place, namely Nagod, in the Satna district of the state of Madhya Pradesh. The college campus is situated half a kilometer south on Maihar road linked to the Satna-Nagod national highway -75. Nagod is geographically located at latitude 24.571823N and longitude 80.820667E. It is well connected by road. By train Satna is the nearest Railway Station in the Mumbai-Allahabad section under West Central Railway .

Govt Jalad Trimurty College, Nagod, named after the three Freedom Fighters Shri Jagganath Dwivedi Sitpura, Shri Lalla Singh, Khamrehi, and Shri Dadan Singh Amkui, Who gave contribution in the freedom struggle in this region. The majority of students come from rural background. Being a government college, it operates within a broader framework laid down by the state government. Despite so many constraints and limited resources at its command, it has shown its growth potential in the past few decades on the academic as well as infrastructural front. The Institution offers under graduate programs—in Arts, Science and Commerce and Post graduate program in Hindi, Political Science, History, MSW and Commerce on a self-financing basis. The college has a small team of able and competent faculty members and office staff.

5. The Student Experience :-

Being a Co-ed institution this college is a good platform for the boys and girls of Nagod and the adjoining villages to fulfill their aspirations of graduating. Even today acquiring a graduate degree carries a great importance to the students hailing from the remote villages of Nagod Sub-division. So the students coming from these villages do feel proud in being the regular students of this college. Many students if not all, cherish their admission in the college and they show their keenness in attending the classes.

In-spite of a great deal of positive intent we fall short of enough efforts to provide optimum facilities to the students. Apart from the basic amenities the college provides good sporting facilities to the students. As the new and spacious library building is under construction we hope to provide good library facility only after one year or so. At present the existing library fulfills the needs of the students to a certain extent there are 35000 books with the library. Apart from the text books the library provides different magazines & books for the preparations of competitive examinations.

As for as " students support services " are concerned the college implements the welfare schemes run by the state government. These schemes are for the students in general.

Financial Aid :- In-order to provide financial aid to the students hailing from economically deprived sections of the society the state government provides scholarships. These scholarships are provided to the students belonging to the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward class groups.

Apart from this, meritorious students hailing from any section of the society or given a consolidated sum of Rs. 5000/- per year. The girls securing 60% marks at the senior secondary level receive this scholarship under the name ' Gaon Ki Beti Yojna ' and ' Pratibha Kiran Yojna ' whereas the boys get this scholarship under the name ' Vikramaditya Yojna '.

From the session 2017-18 the state government has launched another scholarship scheme name ' Mukhyamantri Medhavi Vidyarthi Yojna (MMVY) ' under this scheme the

students of MP Board security 75 % or above marks at the SSC Level and the students of CBSE Board securing 85% or above can seek fee free admission in any Govt. or Private College .

Medical Facilities :- There is no such facility or set-up of any medical facility in the college for the students . only first-Aid treatment facility is available with the sports department .

6. Student Achievements :-

The college provides the facility of courses at the graduate and the Post-graduate levels . These courses are run according to the syllabus drafted by the state government and the University. An increased number of passing students at every level still remains the sole significant academic achievement for the college . Although some students do secure first division marks yet any performance that could outshine all at any level, is awaited yet.

The college has something to cherish about in the name of Non-academic achievements in sports and other extra-curricular activities. Some students have registered their presence at the University and the state level .

Though We lack regular teachers in some subjects yet we hope to achieve our goal with the efforts and dedication of our guest teachers . For this we plan to provide some well equipped smart classes . These smart classes would enhance the efficiency of the teachers to guide the students in a better way and increase the interest of the students to learn quickly and sincerely.

We also plan to provide a broader space for the library . In-order to achieve our aim we are looking ahead to shift our existing library in the new library building . This building is still under construction so we have started efforts for its completion .

Another domain that needs to be touched by us is that of comprehensive guidance for various competitive examinations. As nearly eighty percent of our students hail from the remote villages they do fall short of good guidance for the competitive examinations held through out the year. For this we plan to conduct free of charge continuous coaching classes with the help of some skilled subject experts . These classes will be organized after the scheduled timing for regular classes .
