(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

Government Mahatma Gandhi College, Jawad, Dist. Neemuch (MP) came into existence in 1971 as a private institution run by **Vastra Vyasayi Sangh (Cloth Merchant Association) Jawad**, to cater the needs of the youth of the area. It was taken-over by Department of Higher Education, Bhopal on 1st Sept 1988. The college initially started with Commerce faculty only. Later on, it evolved into a multi-disciplinary institution with a vision to impart quality education to the students of Jawad and the neighbouring villages. Apart from the teaching of the curriculum at UG and PG levels, the institution aims at value based education with blends of character and personality development so that the youth can be groomed into responsible citizens of India.

The college has diverse spectrum of the students belonging to categories like SC, ST, OBC, minorities, etc. Most of the students come from different socio-economic background, caste and creed and more than 60% of the students are girls.

The college offers UG and PG degree in arts, science and commerce faculties. The Department of Higher Education has constituted Janbhagidari Samiti for the development of the college. In view of increasing demand of professional courses to enhance employability of its students, the Samiti has also started self-finance courses – B. B. A., B. A. and B. Com. with Computer Applications, B. Sc. with Computer Science, M. A. in Hindi and M. Com.

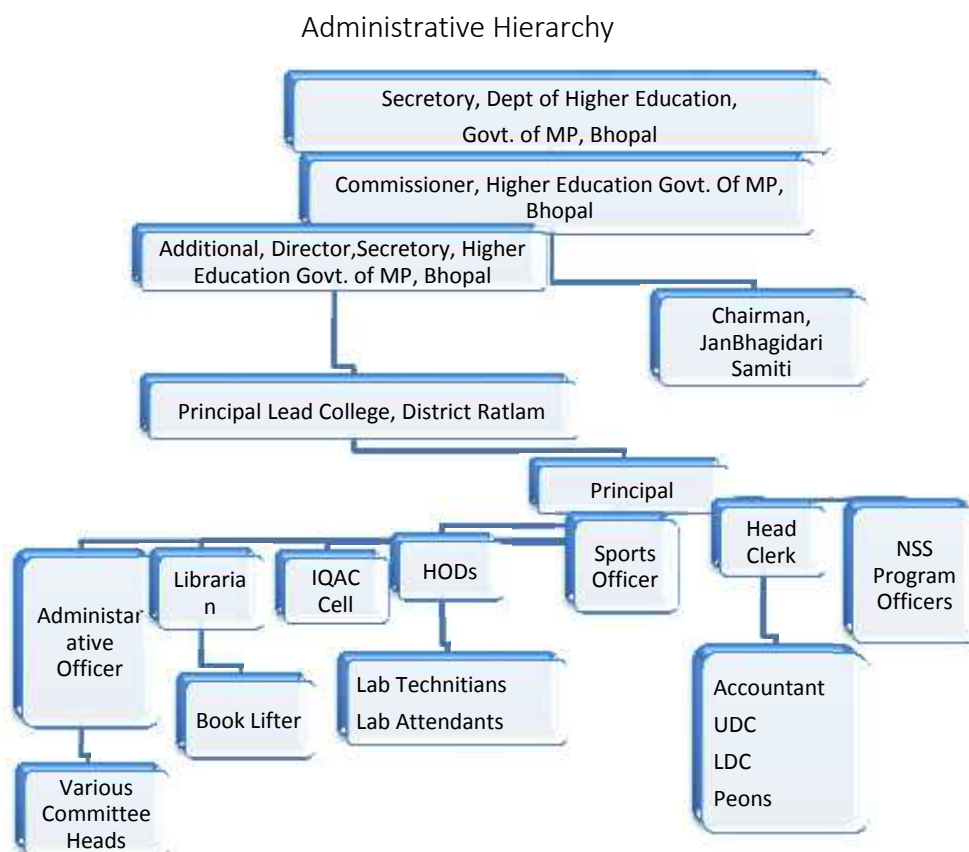

The college has developed infrastructure facilities for the students from the grants received from UGC, state Government and funds available in Janbhagidari Samiti.

- Construction of 20 seater girls' hostel is completed.
- Girls' common room.
- Students of the college participated at district, university and state level tournaments. Students are encouraged to participate in outdoor and indoor games. A big play ground is available for outdoor games for Basketball, Volleyball, Hockey, athletics, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Cricket, etc. Facilities for the sports like Table Tennis, Chess, etc., are also provided.
- The college has rich library with more than 13,200 books on diverse subjects, magazines on science, humanities and current affairs and newspapers. Every year books, magazines, journals are added as per the needs and recommendations of staff & students. Students are allotted a library hour in time table to enrich their knowledge and encourage reading habits. For optimum uses of the Library resources, it is kept open from 10.30 am to 5.30 pm on all working days for the staff and students. Students are encouraged to consult library for books, magazines, newspapers for projects and study materials. Faculty members suggest books and articles/chapters to the learners to supplement lectures. In this way, library resources are augmented to enhance teaching-learning process.
