M.J.S. Government PG Degree College, Bhind, a pioneer college in Chambal Division, was established On 19 Nov' 1956 by the Dept. of Higher Education and inaugurated by the Maharaja Jiwaji Rao Scindia with the two programmes at UG level in B.Sc. and B.A. degree courses. This college is serving as a temple of higher education in

The Chambal region. The College was upgraded to postgraduate status in 1998. It is situated in a Government building. Some blocks have been constructed in recent past by an active cooperation of Janbhagidari Samiti, Govt. of M. P. and UGC. It spreads over a vast campus of 32 Acres.

With a great variety in programme options the college runs departments at UG and PG level in faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. Apart from these courses, the college has B.Sc. with computer science, B.Com. with computer application, B.Sc (Microbiology), B.Sc (Biotechnology) subject under self finance scheme. It was the continuous demand of the students that they should be taught such courses which offer them an opportunity for jobs either in Govt. or in private sectors. So, far other subjects are concerned, college offers facilities of studies in 17 subjects in the faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. The range of these faculties makes the college a unique educational centre in the Chambal Region. The faculty of Arts consists of 11 subjects, producing a good number of talented students. The faculty of Commerce with a less faculty member is providing facilities to the students for pursuing their studies in commerce, computer and management. Faculty of Science is having facilities not only in the traditional subjects like Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Mathematics but in job-oriented subjects i.e., Computer Science, Microbiology under self finance Scheme. The College has PG courses in 14 subjects.

(iii) History of the college with significant milestones

**M.J.S. Govt. PG College, Bhind** is one of the premier institutes in the Chambal Region. It is identified as **Lead College** (**चिन्हितमहाविद्यालय**) of the district. The motto of the college is 'साविद्यायविमुक्तये'. Its motto is taken from first *Skand of Shri Vishnu Puran*. Which means "That is knowledge which liberates one from bondage." Keeping our motto in mind, the institute makes every effort to achieve excellence in academics and extra-curricular activities. In addition to it, the college acquires a great socio-political and historical significance in the sense that **bandit queen Phoolan Devi** surrendered her self on the vast campus of this college on 12<sup>th</sup> February in the year 1983 in the presence of approximately 300 police personnel and a crowd of around 10,000 apart from the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh Shri Arjun Singh. Other members of her gang also surrendered at the same time with her.

### **Strength-**

- (1)
  - (i) 95% Staff is well qualified/or faculty.
  - (ii) Four research centres, with Sanskrit as one of the leading research centre having good research facilities in Gwalior division.
  - (iii) Some of the faculty members are well elevated with global reputation.
- (2) It is remarkable for our institution that it has been re-accredited in II cycle by NAAC in B grade (2.71 in 4.00 scale).
- (3) It is a leading educational centre that fulfils the need of more than 4800 students mostly coming from rural background out of which majority belong to weaker section of societies such SC/ST/OBC and minorities.
- (4) It is noteworthy that our institution was certified with Autonomous status in 1995 by UGC.. This status has been continued after inspections carried out by U.G.C. after definite time intervals.
- (5) On infrastructural grounds, at present the institution has ample infrastructure to fulfill the need of students & it is increasing every year with help of Agencies/organization such as U.G.C./ dept. of Higher Education of M.P.

### **Weaknesses-**

- (1) Since it a Govt. Institution & the faculty has been transferred time to time, because of which some odd situation of teaching may be created. This problem is however met with the help of contractual appointments by Jan Bhagidari.
- (2) In Govt. college no. of teaching posts is decided by the states Govt. Our college has been number of sanctioned posts not in appropriate ratio to met with the demands of increasing strength of students
- (3) Our institution is having less number of recognized research centres. More than 65% total teaching faculty is engaged in research activities in different ways such as participation in seminar, carrying research project guiding of research students etc.

- (4) Our institution is having less number of vocational/ certificate courses under self financing scheme.

### **Opportunity**

- (1) To develop in such a way that the institution meet the requirement of increasing strength every year.
- (2) To demand to Department of higher Education, Govt. of M.P. /Janbhagidari for new posts of teaching as well as non-teaching staff as per requirement.
- (3) Datia is a semi –urban place. New & vocational courses/ certificate courses may be designed & implemented for the fulfillment of need of students in this region and to increase the rate of employment. However B.Sc. with Computer Science is getting good response in our institution.

### **Threats**

- (1) Vocational courses implementation under self finance scheme is a problem as students of the Datia district do not feel comfortable with extra fee structure for such courses.
- (2) The procure new area for the College as strength of the students is increasing every year and at present college campus is not sufficient enough to met with the requirement and with the increasing liability.
- (3) Location of institution is another threat. It is far away from the township because of which students especially girls face problem to reach college.

### **Institutional Development.**

The strategy for the remaining plan period of Maharaja Jiwajirao Scindia Post Graduate College, Bhind rests on the guiding principles, namely, access, equity and excellence.

### **Strategic Plan towards Enhanced Access to Higher Education**

A plan strategy based on certain targets will be more meaningful and fruitful. A target based approach can yield better results. The college keeps the target of GER 35% at the end of 12<sup>th</sup> plan. The strategy of college is to increase student intake not only by introducing new courses and programmes but also by expanding the existing programmes through investment in infrastructural facilities and other basic requirements

**The strategic plan lays emphasis on:**

- **Expanding Classroom and Lab Space**

The existing space is not sufficient for introducing new and relevant courses and programmes and to expand the existing programmes. The existing class rooms are designed to accommodate just 40 to 50 students on average. To introduce interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary programmes, we require class rooms of large size. It also necessitates more lab space, space for ladies room, gents common room, etc.

- **Expanding Hostel Facilities**

At the moment, the college has no hostel whereas the college needs at least two hostels one for boys and one for girls. If we have to attract more number of students from remote places and also from other places, the hostel facility has to be enhanced.

- **Expanding Library Facilities**

The college library has more than 70000 books some of which are rarest of the rare. The library is fully automated and equipped with Wi Fi network. However, the library building is too small to accommodate the books properly with an easy access for the readers. The reading room is also very small and uncozy for the voracious readers. Therefore, there is an urgent need for improving the library facilities by considering the contemporary requirements., The subscription of journals, data bases, e-resources and magazines has to be increased. The seating capacity and rack facility of library has to go up. At the moment, even maintaining the existing facility is a challenge by considering the huge infrastructure and human resource constraints.

- **Expanding Computer Facilities, Provision of Teaching Aids and Audi-visual Facilities.**

Enhancing access to quality higher education means providing opportunity in terms of higher access to computer facilities, teaching and audio -visual aids. The existing facilities in the computer lab have to be increased. The class rooms are to be equipped with modern amenities/equipments to facilitate teaching learning process.
