Government Post Graduate College, Pipariya is one of the oldest and most prestigious institutions of Hoshangabad district. It was established on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1962 as Jai Hind Adarsh Mahavidyalay in response to the educational needs of the people. In the year 1965 the college was undertaken by the department of Higher education, Government of Madhya Pradesh and was christened as Government College, Pipariya. In 1983-84 the college was elevated to Post graduate level study centre. Over the years it has evolved into an ideal centre of education, especially those belonging to socio-economically disadvantaged and minority communities. The college is affiliated to Barkatullah University, Bhopal and is recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act. The college follows the semester system. The National Assessment and Accreditation Committee awarded the college C + grade in 2005.

The college aims to facilitate and promote studies, research and extension activities in the emerging areas of higher education in four disciplines, viz., Arts, Commerce, Science and Law. The student strength is 3147. The college has 21 highly qualified faculty members. The college offers Master's degree in 9 subjects and Bachelor's degree in 16 subjects including five self-financed courses.

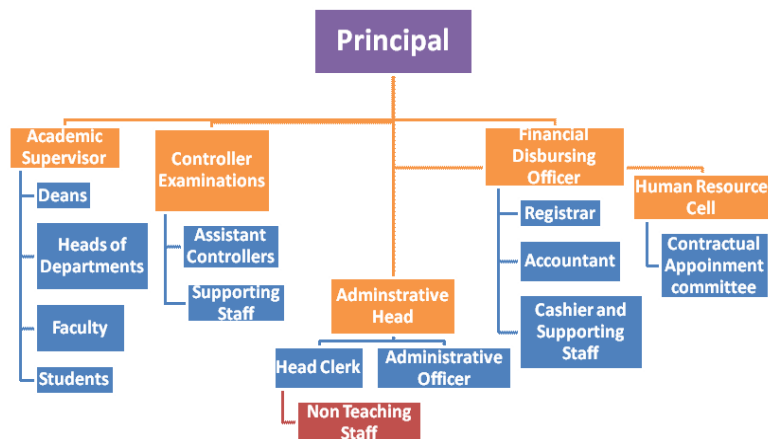

Infrastructure facility available to students are 20 Class rooms , 6 laboratories (Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Geograohy and Computers)NRC centre, One smart class room, Cycle stand, Girls common room, Play ground for foot ball, Volley ball, Cricket, Kho-Kho, Hand ball, Badminton , Table tennis room, Gymnasium room, 2 drinking water coolers, toilets with ramp to physically challenged and wheel chairs and other facilities for Physical challenged.

Although there is no separate Library building, Library runs in two halls of 40 by 50 feet's . There are more than 65000 books, including text books, reference books and journals. Several magazines and news papers are subscribed in the library. Construction of new library is proposed in the near future. Photo copy facility and facilities for scanning , printing are available in the library.

40 computers with 09 internet modem are available in the college, Net work Resource Center is available in the college. All the P.G. Departments are provided with Computers and net facility. Most of the office work is done on line on computers like admissions, fees, salary etc.



- ✓ Personal enhancement & development schemes- NCC, NSS, Facilities for physically challenged & slow learners; Tutor-Guardian Scheme, Grievance Redressal Cell, Entrepreneurship Cell, Remedial classes, Career Guidance Cell.

There is two Boys units of NCC, 13 MP Bat. With a total strength of 107 boys. 6 boys qualified for "C" certificate and 5 boys Qualified for "B" certificate this year. Two Units of NSS one boys and other one girls unit. There is a Grievance Redressal cell in the college which monitors the grievances of staff and students. Teacher guardian scheme is followed Career guidance is given under Vivekanand Career Marg Darshan Yojana There is Personality development cell which organizes various programs for the students as per calendar provided by Department Of Higher Education.

- ✓ Extracurricular activities: Calendar of activities (Sports, Youth Festival, cultural and literary events), Achievements, Awards

Regular sports activities are conducted as per the calendar. There is regular Sports officer in the college who conducts all the games and sports activities as per the schedule. Several students from the college have participated in regional and state level in the Cricket, Kho-Kho, Volley ball , foot ball, and athletics. Two students participated in National chess and two in National yoga competition. Cultural activities are regularly organized in the college, "Yuva utsav" calendar programs are organized. College organizes regional level Quiz "Prashna Manch' which is organized in the college every year.

Several social outreach programs and extension activities are organized through NCC, NSS , Yuva Utsav, Red cross society and other societies. Some of the programs which are regularly organized are NCC and NSS camps, during the camp period extension activities like Hygiene, Environment conservation, adult literacy , Human rights, Social equality and cleanliness drive are followed.
