Part I

- 1. The Principal's Report (2 pages) - Highlights** the key activities, events, and successes of the past year and briefly describes major new initiatives to be undertaken over the next year.

The academic session 2016-17 commenced in July with new admissions having been done online. The new session witnessed the phasing out of the semester system by introducing the annual examination system from the first year. Govt. College, Sihora dist- Narsinghpur has only one regular faculty as such guest faculty were appointed for the duration of the session. In the present session guest faculty were appointed in September. To ensure that classes were held regularly guest faculty were invited under the Janbhagidari Samiti.

The last year we shifted to a new building built under the aegis of the PIU, Narsinghpur. To cater to the safety aspect of the premises closed circuit cameras were installed. In a bid to ensure pure drinking water supply for the staff and the students an

setup.

Under funding available under IT 07 computers were bought and installed. In July of 2017 approx 210 saplings were planted around the inside perimeter of the college building. Letters were written to the PIU to map and build the approach road to the college from the main gate.

The college also wrote to the District Solar Energy Dept. for the survey and eventual installation of a 5 KW solar plant. Looking at the intermittent power scenario in Sihora, we also got an inverter setup.

The college does not have a broadband connexion. The Principal met the TDM (Telecom Divisional Manager) at Narsinghpur and was assured of a high power optic line very soon. In the meantime a wi-fi device provides us with the bare minimum of speed so that the most essential info exchange is dispensed with.

The staff and the office are sensitized enough to help the students who are from a rural background be it filling up of different forms or partial payment of fees. Classes are held with a view to complete the same well in time before the exams.

Vision

To work toward increasing the pass percentage of students and to increase the number of first division students. To inculcate a feeling of involvement in the college as stakeholders.

(ii) Brief introduction of the college (including the status (Govt. / Lead/ Constituent/ Affiliated/ Private), Parent University, UGC recognition, CPE status, etc), location & campus area

Govt. College, Sihora dist-Narsinghpur (M.P) is a co-ed under graduate Arts college affiliated to Rani Durgawati VishwaVidyalaya, Jabalpur. It was established in the year 2010 vide M.P. Govt order एफ 19-2/2010/38- 2 भोपाल dated 23/06/2010. Previously it was run from the premises of the local Higher Secondary School. The college has now shifted operations to its own new building since 02/10/2016. The new college building has 12 rooms, the built up area being 1030 sq.mts. A compound wall runs across the perimeter. The entire area of the premises is 20000 sq.mts.

In July 2017 approx 210 saplings were planted all along the inner perimeter of the college compound wall.

UGC recognition under 2(f) 12(B) is pending as the university demands permanent affiliation. The fee comes to around Rs. 5 lacs, for which the college has requested the DHE to make the funds available.

Consequent to the recognition the college would apply for additional funds available under RUSA and the UGC to boost infrastructure and other student-centric activities. Since its inception in 2010 the college has seen a steady rise in enrolment.

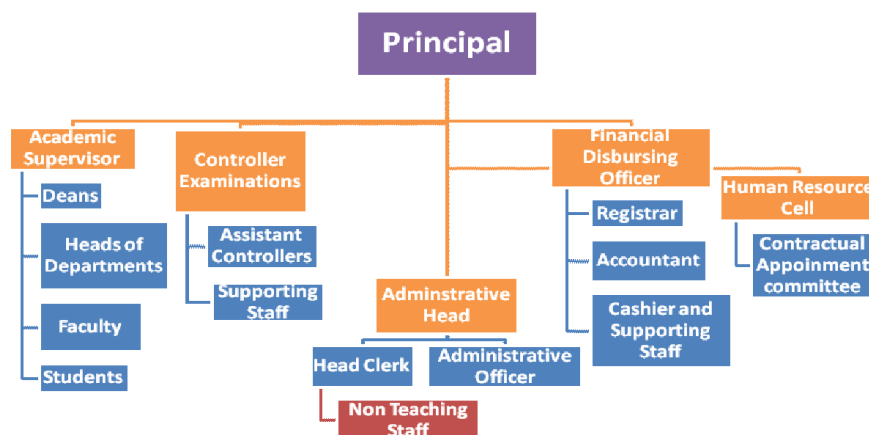

Govt. College Sihora Dist-Narsinghpur is a new college that was founded in 2010 vide a Govt Order. It caters to the educational needs of students coming from a rural background. It was on 02 Oct. 2016 that the college shifted to its new building. Prior to that classes were being held in two rooms provided by the local higher secondary school.

Since it is a new college it needs infusion of infrastructure, furniture and equipment. The new building has ample number of classrooms fitted with white boards and basic dual desks for students. More furniture is needed for the growing number of admissions.

The college is an under graduate arts college so lab equipment is not needed at present. It also lacks the facilities mentioned above eg. Auditorium, sports complex, canteen, garden and hostels.

- Library as a learning resource- advisory committee, its composition, facilities & services (e & print), annual improvement initiatives

The library is looked after by a Guest Faculty. At present books and stationery provided by the DHE is distributed among the students. Some books for current affairs and general awareness are being bought from district level book stores at Narsinghpur.

We are trying to get the library automated and to have relevant furniture provided in the library.

All the students are insured every year.



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
